Adam Carlin: Combing Art and Gourmet Mushrooms



Cortland Breakfast Rotary was joined this week by Adam Carlin, who fascinated the group with the story behind his quickly growing business venture, Talkrot. What started as a hobby to occupy Adam during the winter months stuck indoors has literally bloomed into a business that includes combining displayable works of art with a kit that allows fungi-curious consumers to grow their to own mushrooms at home. With a facility located Tully, Talkrot also grows over ten varieties of gourmet mushrooms that are supplied to restaurants and grocery stores across Central New York. Talkrot also provides an innovative service installing mushroom farms at schools, non-profits, and residential properties. Look out for future programs about mushroom foraging in our own local forests!



Adam Carlin is an artist, educator, and entrepreneur who serves as Executive Director of Women of the Shoah, as well as Co-Director and Co-Founder of A Contemporary Jewish Museum. Previously, he served as Director of Learning & Engagement at the Everson Museum of Art in Syracuse, NY, and held dual positions at UNC Greensboro as Director of Community Engagement for the College of Visual and Performing Arts and Director of the off-campus contemporary art center, Greensboro Project Space. Carlin also cofounded and co-directed Creek Colleges, created schools on the banks of watersheds undergoing active restoration, and Some Thing Spacious, an experimental project space in Oakland, CA that focused on participatory art practices. He holds a BFA in Sculpture from California College of the Arts and an MFA in Art and Social Practice from Portland State University.
