Mike Shafer celebrated the first NBA win of the year by the Boston Celtics.

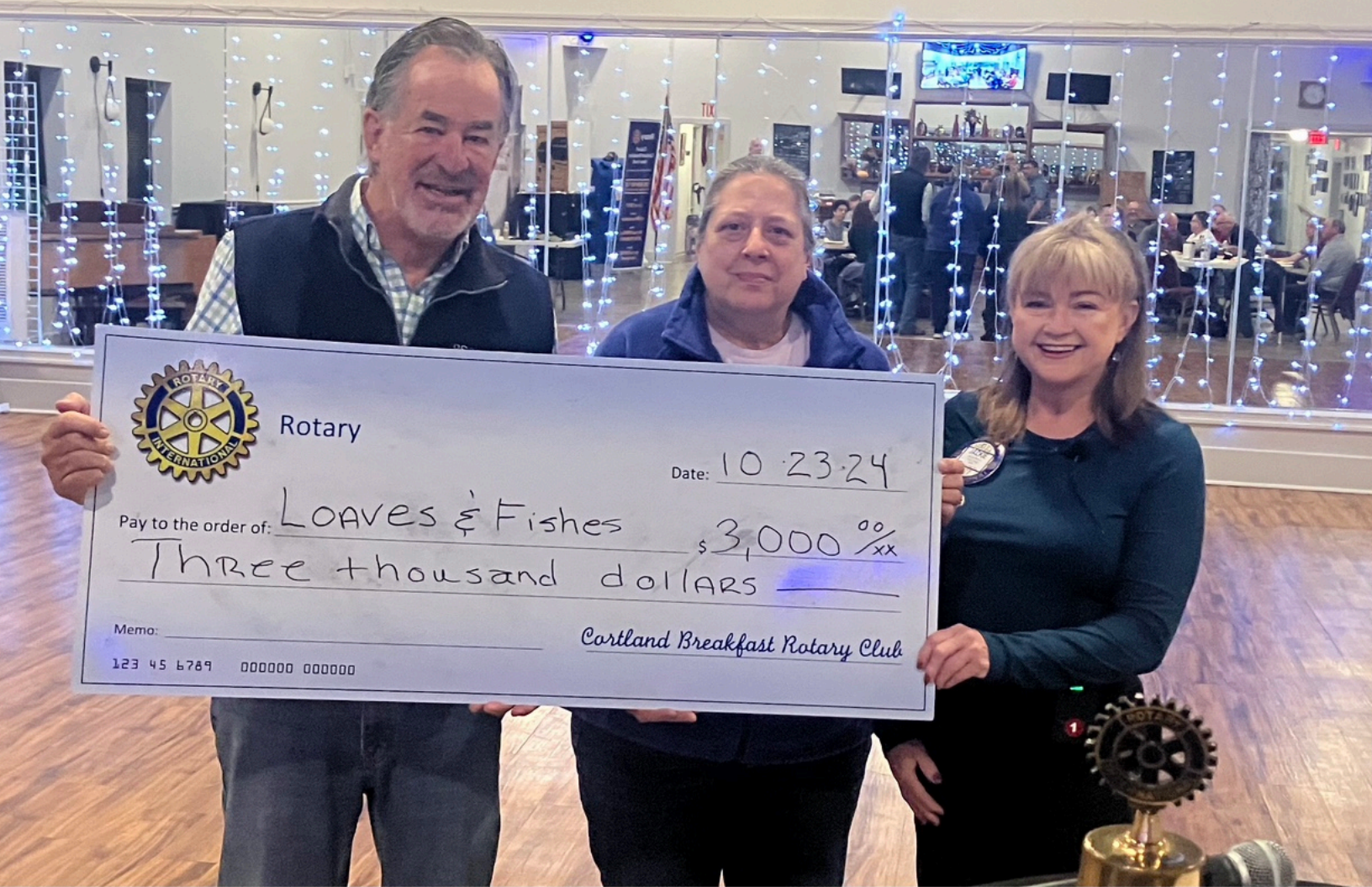
Sophie Clough closed on 40 acres of land in the town of Freetown.

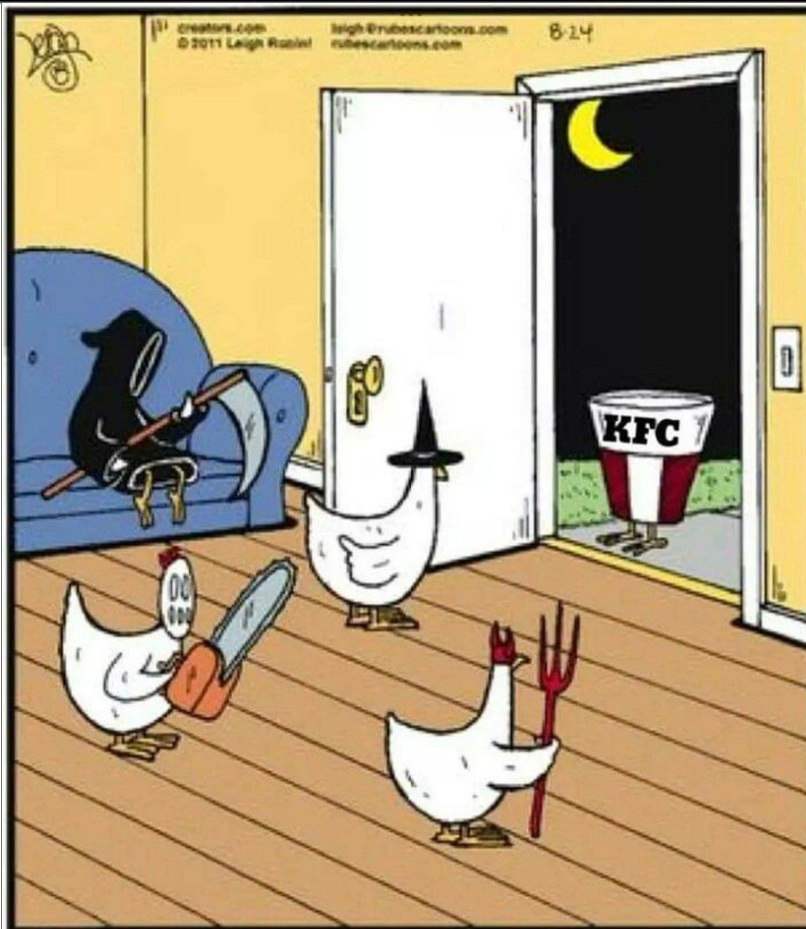
