## Martin Sweeney: "A story that must be told"

Martin Sweeney, retired Homer High School U.S. history teacher and current public historian for both the town and village of Homer, regaled CBR this week with excerpts from his latest book. "The Remarkable Life of Albert Haskell Jr." won 2024 CNY Book Award for Non-Fiction, and includes several tales about Haskell's experiences in Rotary!

Martin had the privilege of looking over scrapbooks kept by the descendants of Albert Haskell Jr., and based on their remarkable contents determined that Haskell's was a "story that must be told."

Referred to in his own lifetime as "Mr. Cortland," Haskell was an accomplished lawyer, politician, banker, civic organizer, supporter of higher education, and promoter of industrial expansion. He was also a founding member of the local Rotary chapter in 1919! Martin read from the chapter titled "The Great Rotary Hijinks," which includes a story about an elaborate scheme of mischief involving a wrecked car being manually pulled up Cortland's Main Street by 52 Rotarians in a torch-lit procession, and supper of pancakes and sausage with maple syrup served out of oil cans, and butter in grease cups. Rotarian James A. Farrell, the primary "victim" of the pranks, was first to be served a large pancake, and when he bit into it found a large steel ring cooked inside.
