

Our club was delighted to welcome Nishi Kadvani, our current exchange student from Rajkot, Gujarat, India, to tell us a bit about herself and her hometown! She is called "Leapling Princess" by her family due to the fact that her birthday falls on February 29th. She enjoys traveling, badminton, and hiking.

Nishi shared with us about the geography, culture, festivals, and clothing in India and of her hometown, although didn't cover much of the history given that it's not really one of her best subjects!

The state of Gujurat, located in the western portion of India, features beautiful coastline and areas of desert. The Statue of Unity, located at the Sardar Sarovar Dam, is the tallest statue in the world with a height of 182 meters. Butter milk is a staple beverage, and regional foods include theplas, khakhras, dhokkas, and khandvi.

Nishi's dad belongs to the Rotary Club of Rajkot Mid-Town, which is incredibly active with 140 members, and involvement in projects that range from the building of a dam, earthquake relief efforts, to the development of a diabetes prevention and management center, and the creation of a doll museum that has connected Rotary Clubs from around the world who have donated ethnic dolls to outfit the museum.
