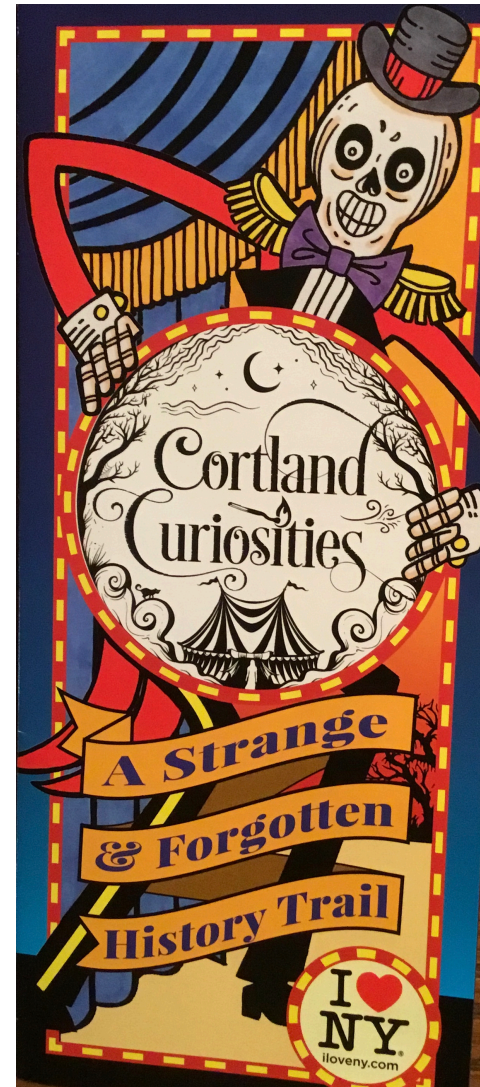


CORTLAND COUNTY—TAKING PRIDE IN COMMUNITY


To date, our drone operators have successfully completed 19 missions utilizing the drone, including public relations projects, missing person's searches, suspect searches, criminal investigations, high-risk search warrants, aerial photography of crime scenes, and even a search for an armed subject in a residence. Each of these missions has enhanced our ability to serve and protect our community more effectively.

Our canine program continues to be vigorous. In 2024 our two operators have: participated in several public outreach demonstrations, successfully located a student who eloped from an elementary school, located discarded stolen property, recovered illegal narcotics from motor vehicles, and assisted on search warrants.

Your support has played a crucial role in making these programs possible. We are truly grateful for your commitment to the safety and well-being of Cortland. We look forward to continuing our work and sharing the positive impact these two programs have on our community.
