ONE DILEMMA SHE HAS SEEN IS THAT WHILE KIDS HAVE CHANGED, TEACHERS HAVE NOT. SHE STARTED EMPOWER EDUCATOR, A PROFESSIONAL SUPPORT FOR AL THE ADULTS IN SCHOOLS—NOT JUST TEACHERS, BUT EVERYONE WHO IS IN CONTACT WITH STUDENTS. EMPOWER EDUCATOR IS NOW INTERNATIONAL WITH FIVE EMPLOYEES.

JEN HELPED US TO UNDERSTAND THE ROLE THAT STRESS
PLAYS IN OUR LIVES. STRESS PREVENTS US FROM BEING IN
THE PRESENT, AND DOESN'T ALLOW US TO FOCUS ON
WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW. WHEN TEACHERS HAVE STRESS
AND BURNOUT, IT IS THE KIDS THAT SUFFER.



Dear Breakfast Club, Cortland Rotary:

Thank you for your support of our 9th Annual Back to School PREP event! With your help, we Provided Resources and Essentials to Prepare kids for school. We committed to serving 350 kids this year, and as in past years, we required pre-registration to ensure proper sizes. We opened online registration on July 1, and filled all 350 spots by July 3, demonstrating the great need of our community.

- We provided NEW sneakers, socks, and underwear to 350 kids. Kids were from all school districts in Cortland County.
- For the 152 families, we provided a bag of toiletries (shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and soap) and back-to-school snacks. Homer Food Pantry contributed bags of Goldfish crackers and fruit cups, and Seven Valleys Food Rescue provided applesauce cups and granola packets. Dentes Dental provided all the toothbrushes.
- With assistance from the Homer School district libraries and through the non-profit shopping day of the Friends of the Tompkins County Public Library book sale, we provided an ageappropriate book to each child.
- We also provided community resource information to each family on transportation assistance, area food pantries, and health resources.

We believe that children cannot meet their full potential in school if they and their families are struggling with basic needs. This annual event continues to fill a gap in our community and assists families with one of the most expensive items for school – sneakers. A well-fitting, proper sneaker not only boosts confidence but also allows children to fully participate in physical education classes and recess, contributing to overall health and well-being.

Thank **YOU** for helping give a child a strong start to the school year. While Homer Congregational Church coordinates the event, it truly is a county-wide outreach effort, and we could not host it without the support of the entire community. We look forward to your continued support in the

Drug Take Back Event

Cortland County Sheriff Mark Helms, in partnership with the Cortlandville Fire Department, Cincinnatus Fire Department, Marathon Fire Department, and the Marathon Area Volunteer Ambulance Corps (MAVAC), proudly announces the Fall 2024 Drug Take Back Event scheduled for Saturday September 28th, 2024, to be held in three locations:

- Cortlandville Fire Department from 9am noon
- Marathon Village Green/ High School from 9am 11am
- Cincinnatus Fire Department from 9am 11am

This is a drive thru style event to help the public dispose of any unused, unsure, or outdated medications in the easiest and most efficient manner possible, while ensuring these medications are kept out of the hands of youth and are safely disposed of.

Thanks to my friends in the Cortlandville, Cincinnatus, and Marathon Fire Departments, there will once again be annual Drug Take Back Events each year.

For anyone that may not be able to attend the Drug Take Back Events, there are multiple permanent medication disposal kiosks available in Cortland County, some for example are located at our Police Departments in Cortland County:

- Cortland County Sheriff's Office: 54 Greenbush Street, available 24/7
- City of Cortland Police Department: 25 Court Street, available 24/7
- Village of Homer Police Department: 43 James Street, Monday-Friday, 8am-4pm
- SUNY Cortland Police Department (Whitaker Hall): 4 Pashley Drive, available 24/7

These Kiosks can be utilized throughout the year without waiting for a specific drug take back event, ensuring that residents can dispose of medications safely at any time.

Unfortunately, we will be unable to take liquid medications or sharps at this event.
