'I CAN SPEND MY LIFE BEING THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN SIGHT & DARKNESS' Dr. Anshu Chandra & the Global Eye Project

Dr. Anshu Chandra shared with Cortland Breakfast Rotary about her incredible service of providing eye care to underserved communities around the globe.

Upon earning her Doctor of Optometry degree, Dr. Chandra realized that she would rather provide her skills to those who need them most. She turned down two job offers in the US, taking up part-time work that could offer the flexibility to go and serve by providing eye clinics in communities that include India, Nepal, Peru, Lebanon, and Haiti.

Dr. Chandra found herself returning over and over to Haiti, just a four-hour flight away, where she realized that their need went beyond her visits to requiring a permanent eye clinic. Her goal became to find a way to develop a sustainable program, empowering local community members by providing education and professional training services. In 2015, a clinic was opened in Fond-des-Blancs. The model was to provide free consults, and affordable fees for glasses. As of December 2024, the clinic has provided over 120,000 free eye exams, and has been able to make a shift from treatment to a focus on prevention of eye diseases.

The clinic in Fond-des-Blancs now faces an urgent challenge. The space they've operated in for nearly a decade is no longer available, and they must raise \$300,000 to build a permanent facility.
